Genderqueer Non-Binary: gqnb

- umbrella terms include transgender, genderfluid...
- identities as counterresponse to the politicization and normalization of bodies and desires.
- problem when binaries box people (in or out), or erase: story of island with 17 genders and anthropologist who only sees men and women
- **Riki Wilchins:** Our problem is not fighting for the rights *of* specific individuals, but rather fighting for the right to *be* different kinds of individuals? Do we want to make genderqueerness OK, just as gay rights is making gayness OK? Or do we want to attack the notion of normative genders itself?
