Buffalo—Declaring opposition to proposals to establish classification of motion pictures in New York State, Sidney J. Cohen, president of the Allied Theatres of New York State told THE FILM DALY yesterday that he had not been invited to any of the legislative committee hearings on the subject.

The hearings, under the auspices of the Legislative Joint Committee for Study and Dissemination of Offensive and Obscene Material, have been held in New York City and Buffalo, with additional meetings proposed for Rochester, Syracuse and Plattsburg.
