

- meet all rubric standards: Learning Goal, Reflection on and Personalization of Learning Goal, Examples, Support of Arguments, Communication
- specifically address each of the items in the learning goal:
 - discover relationships—how IGS helped you to discover relationships as you dragged—what did you discover?
 - demonstrate they seem—IGS can help us discover and have aha moments and can seem convincing but is never a proof—why?
 - wide variety of examples—benefits of dynamic dragging in IGS (versus still picture or no visualization)

- you is not typical in reflections—we or I is better
- personalizing
- too informal: got, thing, math...
- text itself in standard font typically 2–3 pages single spaced
