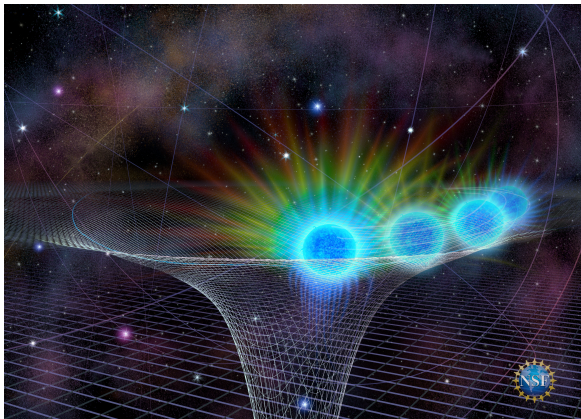



- Stand up and share your preferred name(s) and majors and minors. If working with a partner, stand up together.
